# **United in Service**

### **Snapshot of Service**

In 2019, Broadway Bank employees donated 13,829 hours to various non-profit organizations in San Antonio, Austin and the surrounding communities, an equivalency of \$333,832.06\*. Care Corps volunteers supported 189 charitable projects in addition to the projects they support individually. In 2019, Broadway Bank corporate contributions were \$898,447.54 through approximately 649 separate donations to 161 local community organizations.

#### **Traditions that Matter**

**United Way Capital Campaign**—employees donated \$319,731.63 boosted by a bank contribution of \$121,653 for a total of \$441, 384.63 raised for local programs.

#### **Education**

- San Antonio Education
   Partnership—awarded 10,000 to a high school graduate.
- Stuff The Bus with Communities In Schools of San Antonio and The Hispanic Chamber of Commerce—this was Broadway Bank's 10 year anniversary participating in this community initiative to collect school supplies. Collected school supplies and monetary donations had an estimated value of \$51, 838, a 12% increase from 2018.
- Habitat for Humanity—Bi-monthly home construction project and financial education courses for new homebuyers.
- McCollum High School and Southwest High Schools implemented mPOWER financial education with students, empowering them to tackle important money management decisions.

#### **Health and Social**

- Mobilizing for MS—raised \$40,574 for Multiple Sclerosis in 2019.
- American Diabetes Association raised \$2,500.
- Salvation Army Angel Tree employees granted Christmas wish lists bringing joy to 150 senior citizens and children.

#### Mentoring

- San Antonio Youth Literacy Reading Buddy Program—worked with students to improve their reading levels.
- Serna Elementary—Mentoring partnership at the school.

#### **Nourishing the Hungry**

- San Antonio Food Bank—adopted a Grocery Rescue Truck which collects food that has been set aside by businesses and re-distributes it to families in need through its partner agency network.
- Society of St. Vincent de Paul at Haven for Hope—served thousands of dinners to the homeless throughout the year.
- CanStruction Event— Broadway
   Bank participated in the CanStruction
   event hosted by AIA. This event
   brings awareness to hunger by
   having local organizations build
   structures from canned goods. As
   part of this event, Broadway also
   hosted a canned food drive. We
   provided over 3,539 lbs of food
   equivalent to 2,787 meals to the San
   Antonio Food Bank.
- Snack Pak 4 Kids San Antonio hosted annual peanut butter drive, worked at monthly stocking and packing nights and distributed weekly Snack Paks to classrooms and children's homes.
